Social Science Education

The Social Science Education major prepares students for certification to teach in public and private secondary schools, and meets requirements for Missouri teacher certification, including reciprocity with many states. The program requires 40 credit hours from anthropology, economics, geography, government, history, psychology and sociology.

The following Program Learning Outcomes have been established by Evangel faculty to define the areas of knowledge and skills that students graduating from this major degree program should have developed.

- 2. Explain principles expressed in documents shaping Constitutional Democracy in the United States
- 3. Explain continuity and change in the history of Missouri, the United States, and the World
- 4. Discuss principles and processes of governance systems
- 5. Discuss economic concepts and principles
- 6. Identify elements of geographical study and analysis
- 7. Compare relationships of individuals and groups to institutions and cultural traditions
- 8. Utilize social science tools and inquiry
