

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN SCHOOL COUNSELING (ONLINE)

Fact Sheet



School counselors are vital members of the K-12 education team who help all students to become productive adults of tomorrow.

Evangel University's **Master of Science in School Counseling** prepares students to become professional school counselors with the skills required to design, implement, evaluate and continually improve a comprehensive school counseling program that **promotes** and **enhances student success**.

- Prepares students for counseling roles in public and private school communities.
- Completion of coursework satisfies specific course requirements for certification as a school counselor & licensure as a **Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC)** in Missouri.
- Graduates may pursue Missouri certification as a **School Psychological Examiner**.



Prerequisites:

- Baccalaureate degree with a 3.0 GPA or higher
- Six credits in psychology with a B- or higher

Program format: Each summer semester, new students will begin an online journey to completing the required 60 credit hours to become a school counselor. Students will take an average of 6-9 credits per 15-week semester. Courses include synchronous class time along with asynchronous instruction.

Program start: Summer with 2- four day, on campus residencies

Tuition: \$420 per credit

Online Application, three references, resume, APA writing sample, statement of purpose, interview, and background check (required for practicums and internships)
