

## Master of Science in Counseling (Clinical Mental Health and School Counseling Tracks)

School counselors must take two credentialing exams (MOCA, MOSCPA) in order to be a certified school counselor in Missouri. Clinical mental health graduates must pass the National Counselor Examination (NCE) to apply for licensure in Missouri.

The Evangel University College of Adult and Graduate Studies requires masters' degrees to be completed within a five year time frame. Completion rates are calculated by determining how long it takes students to complete their degree from their initial start date. The percentage for a given year is an aggregate of the percentage of those who graduated the previous year plus those who graduated for the current year. Since counseling students begin in the fall and continue through the summer, an academic year begins in the fall and is completed in the following summer term.

Similar to completion rates, retention rates are calculated over a five year period. Retention rates are calculated based on the aggregate number of withdrawn students subtracted from a specific start date (cohort) divided by the original number of students enrolled at the same start date.
