

Community Relief and Development Minor (21 hours)

This multidisciplinary minor equips students with basic theoretical understandings of issues related to domestic and international community relief and development, as well as entry-level skills and interventions. Students will take multi-disciplinary courses to prepare them for a capstone internship experience, working with a non-profit specializing in either community relief, development or both. Specific objectives of the minor include education surrounding issues of diversity, crisis, disaster response, theology of compassion and practical tools for community development.
