Requirements are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. ACT English less than 19 or SAT Writing less than 460 = ENGL 102 (grade of A/B goes to COMM 205) b. ACT English 20-23 or SAT Writing 470-540 = ENGL 111 c. ACT English 24-25 or SAT Writing 550-580 = take writing proficiency in 1st sem. (pass = COMM 205; fail = ENGL 111) <p>2. To meet graduation requirement, students must visit wellness assessment kiosk once a semester and log physical activity in student portal (45 hours total by graduation).</p>
