Dear Counseling Student;

The Counseling Program has graduate assistantships available for the upcoming academic year. Assistantships qualify as campus employment and will either be \$1,800 for one semester or \$3,600 which is paid out over the traditional academic year. If you are interested in applying for an assistantship please submit an application to Amanda Cox at CoxA@evangel.edu. **The deadline is the first Friday in June.**

The application calls for a personal statement explaining why you are a good candidate to receive a graduate assistantship. Please feel free to attach additional information or documents to the application.

Graduate assistantships are awarded on:

1. Academic performance (GPA, awards, research, service)
2. Financial need
3. Leadership – professional activity, goals towards doctoral studies in counselor education
4. Skills - Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, Publisher), research skill, APA writing, learning management systems
5. Enrolled full time
6. Availability
