<b>BIOL 123 Nutrition</b> The nutritional requirements of human beings with emphasis on the roles of nutrients throughout the life cycle. <i>Course has weekly due dates. See the Evangel Bookstore for required textbooks.</i>	ODE 1	3	\$195
<b>ENGL 123 Introduction to Literature</b> Introduction to understanding and interpreting literature. Literary selections drawn from various cultures and at least three common genres. <i>Course has weekly due dates. See the Evangel Bookstore for required textbooks.</i>	ODE 1	3	\$195
<b>FIN 138 Personal Finance</b> The purpose of this course is to provide the student an overview of the role stewardship plays in one's daily life. There is a strong emphasis placed on Biblical purposes of money, attitudes towards financial wealth, and accountability for personal resource choices. <i>Course has weekly due dates. <b>GEOG 211 World Regional Geography</b> Regional approach to the study of the patterns that people make on the earth as the result of their political, social, economic, and cultural activities and the interaction and impact of the earth and the natural environment on people's activities. <i>Course has weekly due dates. <p><b>GSCI 115 Physical Science w/ Lab</b>            Study of motion and energy, the basic ideas of electricity, the phenomena of light and radiation, elementary thermodynamics, and the structure of matter in terms of atoms and molecules and their nature. 1-credit laboratory course included.  <i>Course has weekly due dates. See the Evangel Bookstore for required textbooks.</i></p>	ODE 1 (with LAB ODE 51)	4	\$260
<p><b>HIST 111 American History I</b>            Survey from the time of discovery and exploration of America through the founding and development of the 13 English colonies, the Revolutionary War, the establishment of the United States Constitution and government, the War of 1812, westward expansion and manifest destiny, states' rights, slavery, the Civil War, and Reconstruction.  <i>Course has weekly due dates. See the Evangel Bookstore for required textbooks.</i></p>	ODE 1	3	\$195
<p><b>MATH 210 Elementary Statistics</b>            Descriptive statistics including univariate, bivariate, and multivariate data; binomial and normal probability distributions; and confidence intervals, parametric, and non-parametric hypothesis tests. Uses a statistical software package such as SPSS. Satisfies mathematics proficiency requirements.  <i>Course has weekly due dates. <p><b>MATH 231 Calculus I</b>            Introduction to the concepts of calculus, including coordinate systems, curve analysis, derivatives and differentials, time-related changes, maxima and minima, integration, and related topics. <b>Prerequisite: Pre-Calculus Algebra</b>  <i>Course has weekly due dates. See the Evangel Bookstore for required textbooks.</i></p>	ODE 1	4	\$260
<p><b>PHIL 115 Introduction to Philosophy</b>            Exploration of topics in informal and inductive reasoning with emphasis on recognizing and evaluating arguments and fallacies in ordinary, literary, and scientific contexts.  <i>Course has weekly due dates. See the Evangel Bookstore for required textbooks.</i></p>	ODE 1	3	\$195
<p><b>PSYC 138 Psychology of Healthy Relationships</b>            This course provides foundational exploration regarding personal wholeness in relationship to self, family, others and God. Emphasis is placed on personal application of course material to promote greater self-awareness and ability to live out healthy choices regarding areas explored in the course. Theoretical models are explored regarding development, mental health and relationships to include recognizing and coping with stress and interpersonal conflicts.  <i>Course has weekly due dates. <b>ENGL 111 Composition</b> Introduction to the thesis-support essay form, including informative, persuasive, and documented, with an emphasis on avoiding plagiarism. Includes strategies for organizing, writing, editing, revising, quoting, summarizing, paraphrasing, and documenting. <i>Self-paced course; all course materials included with registration.</i>	ODE 22	3	\$195
<b>HIST 112 American History II</b> Survey from 1877, examining American institutions and ideas; the rise of nationalism; the emergence of America as a strong nation; WWI and the Great Depression; WWII and the Cold War; and the United State's role in the worldwide political situation. <i>Self-paced course; all course materials included with registration.</i>	ODE 22	3	\$195
