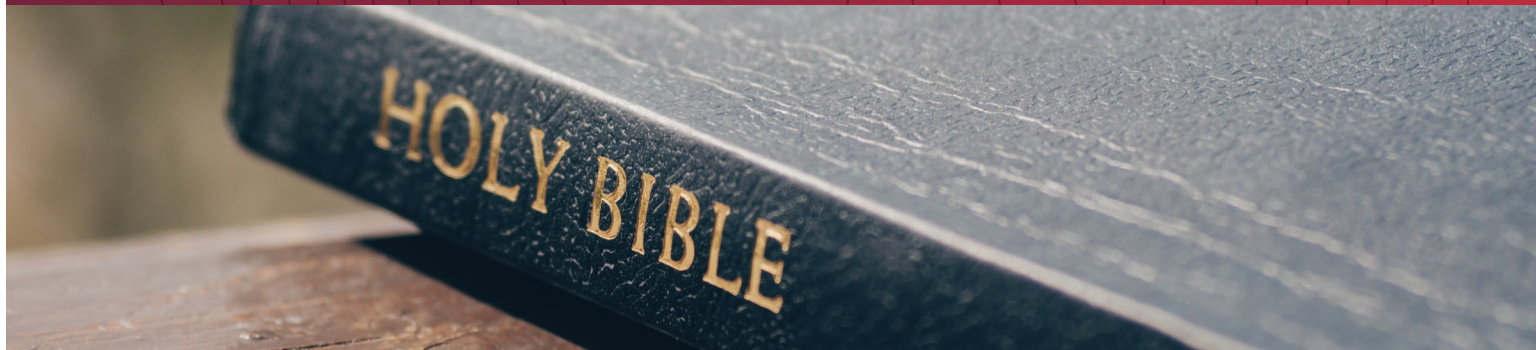


# Credentialing Certificate
