

EU Outstanding Young Alum Hannah Beers Sutton (EU '16)

Hannah Beers Sutton is a seasoned political strategist and executive director of the Missouri House Republican Campaign Committee (HRCC). In this role, she leads campaign strategy, fundraising, and independent expenditures, helping secure and sustain one of the largest Republican majorities in Missouri history.

A 2016 Evangel graduate, Sutton earned her degree in Advertising & Public Relations while serving as student body president and chair of the Missouri Federation of College Republicans.

She began her career in the Missouri Senate before joining Clout Public Affairs at Axiom Strategies, where she rose to vice president and directed more than 100 winning political and public affairs campaigns across the state.

Since stepping into her leadership role at HRCC in 2024, Sutton has guided the committee through high-stakes races, managing multimillion-dollar budgets and navigating intense outside opposition. Her steady leadership and clear vision have been instrumental in maintaining Republican strength in Missouri's legislature.

She and her husband, Wes, live in Jefferson City, MO with their sons, Palmer and Bennett.

CBC Distinguished Alum Asif Shaikh (CBC '93)

Asif Shaikh serves as an Olympic chaplain, ministering to athletes on the world's largest stages, including the Games in London, Rio, Paris, Sochi, and South Korea. He has also been chaplain for various athletic world championships, Pan American Games, and a FIFA World Cup.

Shaikh was born into a Muslim family in Pakistan and came to faith in Christ at age 11. He kept his conversion private until 18, when he told his father and shared his desire to attend Central Bible College to prepare for ministry.

After graduating from CBC in 1993, Shaikh spent 15 years with CRU and Athletes in Action, ministering to college students at the University of South Florida, University of Tampa, and St. Petersburg College.

His chaplaincy work continues to expand, including opportunities at Kennesaw State University and with Georgia Tech Track and Field, Team USA Soccer, and a unique weekly chapel service via Zoom for WWE (World Wrestling Entertainment).

He and his wife, Leaha, have been married 25 years and have two daughters. They live near Atlanta, GA.

CBC Outstanding Young Alum Austin Westlake (CBC '13)

Austin Westlake, a third-generation Assemblies of God minister, serves as national youth director for the Assemblies of God, a position he assumed in December 2024. In this role, he travels the nation speaking at camps, conventions, and leadership summits.

Known for his humor and powerful Gospel delivery, Westlake previously served as director of student discipleship for AG National Youth Ministries from 2022 to 2024.

Called to preach at 16, Westlake graduated from Central Bible College with a degree in Church Leadership. His first ministry role was youth pastor at Sheffield Family Life Center in Kansas City, MO. During his nearly two decades of Spirit-anointed leadership at SpiritCHURCH, Wootton earned a master's in theology from Oral Roberts University in 2007 and a Doctor of Ministry degree from the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary in 2012.

A trusted voice within the AG fellowship, Wootton has served as a general presbyter, OK District executive presbyter, Evangel University board of trustee member, and AGTS advisory board chairman.
