Employment in Service After Graduation

NOTE: The denominational polity in which AGTS operates, General Council of the Assemblies of God USA, does not require formal education for ministerial credentialing or service. In this regard, AGTS does not have a formal placement service with the General Council for placing its graduates into ministerial service. Ministerial service in the local church is determined by each General Council approved church polity and governance structure. Despite the fact that formal placement cannot be guaranteed, AGTS graduates are either already embedded in ministerial service, or anticipate involvement in ministerial service in church and parachurch contexts as described in the following table.
